It Takes More Than Food To End Hunger

Life is unpredictable and a safety net is critical for every family. As our new name implies, we "fulfill" the greater needs of the hungry, from distributing nutritious food to providing life-changing resources – resources that help families move past the rough times.

Jack lost both his job and his job-based health insurance in one day, leaving himself, his wife Cindy and their two children financially vulnerable.* As the stress of looking for new employment continued, Jack suffered a heart attack and was hospitalized. Cindy's part-time employment was not enough to pay for the mortgage, utilities, the cost of COBRA, and food. Adding to their struggle, doctors determined that Jack's heart condition was disabling and returning to full-time employment would no longer be an option for him. His only recourse was to apply for permanent disability. For someone who worked hard all his life, it was a tough decision.

The family turned to **Fulfill** and Susan, one of our many Resource Connection Specialists, for help. "I used our network of partners and connections to other nonprofits to get them assistance," said Susan. "We were able to provide them access to healthcare through NJ Family

Care, the SNAP program to help with food, utility assistance, free financial counseling from the Financial Success Center, and a one-time mortgage payment from St. Vincent de Paul."

Today, the family is back on the road to financial recovery, and they no longer need the benefits they received,

including SNAP.



experienced an incredible recordbreaking year in which 82 schools and 14 sponsors worked together and helped to provide close to 200,000 meals this holiday season.

All those who donated played an important role in ending hunger, right in their own communities. We especially want to recognize Midstreams Elementary School, who received the Heavyweight Champion Award for collecting the most poundage. From the start of the program, this school was determined

to really make a difference and win. Not only did Midstreams collect 3,268 pounds of food, but they also raised over \$3,000 in donations. To put that in perspective, for every dollar raised, **Fulfill** can provide 3 meals to someone in need. Overall, between food and fund donations, they provided over 11,000 meals!

Helping the Bees and Reducing Hunger Together

magine a world without almonds, apples or fragrant flowers...Unfortunately, that's the shocking future we face if we don't work to help our most precious pollinator: bees. They are at the heart of our survival - one in three bites of food we eat depends entirely on bees - and they are dying out.

The Honeybee Conservancy is a 501c3 non-profit organization that works to help the bees, while increasing access to organic, sustainable food in under-served communities. This year, **Fulfill** is proud to be a recipient of a grant from the Sponsor-a-Hive program from the conservancy.

The Sponsor-A-Hive program strategically places bees in gardens and urban farms that are doing exceptional work to grow fresh produce for schools, soup kitchens, senior



citizen centers, and low income neighborhoods. By adding bees to these vibrant gardens, fruit and vegetable quality improves and the amount of food grown increases up to 71%!

Through this program, grantees receive free bees, bee hives, equipment and support. This year, **Fulfill** was chosen to receive: one beekeeping beginner kit, which includes a queen bee and her court, a 3 lb. package of bees, and a beekeeping suit. The bees will arrive by Spring. "These bees will be a wonderful addition to our garden and will help us grow even more produce in our garden next year," said Garden Coordinator Jess Sinkhorn.


Saturday Deliveries Help Pantries Boost Their Food Capacity and Offer Nutritious Groceries to More Families

Some of **Fulfill's** program partners are small capacity pantries without a lot of storage, who are serving an increasing number of local families.

In order to help meet the demand, **Fulfill** is providing Saturday deliveries of fresh produce, frozen meats and other nutritional proteins to complement the array of groceries available at monthly pantry sites.

One Saturday stop is Shore Vineyard Church pantry that

serves 129 families, which is more than 350 individuals a month in South Toms River. This faith-based pantry is run by church leadership and about 25 additional volunteers. "We are located in a community that needs help after the effects of Superstorm Sandy and the economy, and the need just keeps growing," said Co-Director Jack Thal. "We don't have enough storage space so the Saturday deliveries allow us to serve more families healthy, fresh food."



Meet Andrew

Andrew was 58 years old, homeless, and living in the woods when a friend brought him to the Shore Vineyard Church in Toms River. "I knew I wanted to change my life," he said, "but I wasn't sure how to get help." He soon made friends at the Church, who referred him to The B.E.A.T. Center in Toms River. There, he received food from the Peoples Pantry and help from a Fulfill

Resource Connection Specialist, who signed him up for healthcare.

Andrew received the health care he needed as well as employment and a place to live. Today, he volunteers at the pantry that once helped him - to help others and to give back. "I'm so thankful for my friends, the church, and this pantry," says Andrew. "Even my worst days now are good, compared to where I was."

After-School Meals Help Kids and Working Parents

School Meals Program at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Monmouth County. We recently met this father of two of the children served by the program. When he picks them up, he sits and talks to them as they finish dinner. When asked how important the food that is served to the community is, his response was, "It is extremely important. There are many kids that don't

have an opportunity to eat dinner after they leave here. I'm sure some parents are working 13-14 hours a day at 2 or 3 jobs. The food from **Fulfill** literally saves lives and it puts parents' minds at ease knowing that the club feeds our children."
