Grandparents Raising Grandchildren is not Uncommon in our Community – How the FoodBank can Help



Meet Mr. Dixon, a grandparent who currently has custody of his twin granddaughters. According to the latest Hunger Study, he represents 22% of adults in Monmouth and Ocean Counties who are raising their grandchildren. Mr. Dixon was on disability but wanted to provide a stable home for the girls, which they didn't

have with their parents. So he sought help from the FoodBank and one of our outreach specialists helped him apply for SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits, one of the many services we provide.

"The SNAP benefits help me provide healthier meals for my granddaughters. Having access to local pantries is a tremendous help to supplement what I have to make 3 square meals for them. I feel like the pantries are not only giving me food, but encouragement and hope. This has moved me to want to give to someone else by volunteering at the pantries as well."

Mr. Dixon's hope is to move forward by being there for his granddaughters and helping them with their care, homework and educational needs. He is waiting for the girls to go to school full time so he can go back to work. In the meantime, taking care of them is his top priority.



Get the "Buzz"

New additions to The FoodBank Organic Garden!

The FoodBank organic garden is abuzz with news! We've added Jess Sinkhorn to our staff as Garden Coordinator and he's bringing some fresh ideas and two honeybee hives to the garden. The garden provides 2,000 pounds of fresh produce annually to our feeding program pantries, including our mobile pantry, as well as herbs for our culinary kitchen cooks.

"I'm very excited to be here," says Jess. "My goal this year is to focus on production, education and preventing food waste, and to encourage more community garden partners to join us in the fight against hunger. I'll be looking for volunteers who want to help us get the word out as well as plant, weed and harvest our crops. We'll also be adding some cooking demos with recipes to our mobile pantry."

Some new additions to the garden this year include two active honeybee hives that will produce local honey by fall, as well as seven new Asian Pear Trees, which are known for their resistance to disease and pests. The trees have been donated by Drew Madzin, In Memoriam of his beloved wife Patty. We are also grateful to Monmouth Park Charity Fund, which is supporting the garden this year with a \$3000 grant.

Congratulations to Howell Middle School South for their award-winning performance — winners of the top prize — The Heavyweight Champion Award!

In the 10 years of Students Change Hunger, The FoodBank of Monmouth and Ocean Counties has never seen a school bring in as many pounds of food as Howell Middle School South did this year. Their creativity and perseverance to win the competition was notable and they took home The Heavyweight Champion Award (14,810 pounds of food collected), as well as winning their Division and joining the prestigious 5,000 pound club!

This year, the food and funds collected totaled a record-breaking 115,081 pounds, with more than \$15,000 in funds. There were 66,000 student competitors and all of them contributed to making sure that hunger won't win here! Chris Burnett, alumnus of the FoodBank Culinary Arts Training Program, says his dream was for everyone to know him, because when people got to know him, they would definitely want to do business with him. In January, his wish was granted with a broadcast television debut on Food Network's "Chopped" culinary competition show, where his memorable

performance and Japanese Whiskey BBQ Wings were praised by the judges.

But things were not always so easy for Chris. He lost his mother when he was 11 years old, grew up in the foster care system, and served time in prison before finally turning his life around. It was cooking that got him through his most difficult times. "When I came to the FoodBank Culinary Training Program, I was already taking care of my daughter and cooking at a very low-wage job, but I knew I needed structure and a better foundation to really succeed. I couldn't afford a fancy cooking school so this program was great for me. I was taught the basics, but the value of the experience was much more than that. Chef Ray was my role model as a chef and as a person, and I made him a promise that one day I would make it big and impress him."

Impress he did! Since appearing on the show, Chris' notoriety has soared. "I don't forget where I come from," he says. He's currently giving back to the community that cheered him on by working with a local middle school judging their own culinary competition, as he runs his successful catering business, Handsome Creations Catering. There, he enjoys surprising people with his creative creations at weddings, parties and small, exclusive gatherings. 
There's No Place Like the FoodBank The FoodBank 2017 Humanitarian Gala


