Dear Friends of Fulfill,

Welcome to our **"Shine Light on Hunger" 2020 Virtual Humanitarian Gala**. As we adjust to the new norm, we recognize our accomplishments before COVID-19 hit, and we applaud our staff's extraordinary efforts during the ongoing pandemic to help a growing number of struggling neighbors in Monmouth and Ocean Counties put food on their tables.

Our work to alleviate hunger and build food security took a large step last year. ***We served more than 136,000 people and provided more than 12 million meals to families, children, seniors, veterans, and the working poor. Nearly 3 million pounds of fresh produce was also distributed through our network of 289 food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and other feeding agencies.***

David and the team are proud to have donated over half a million dollars to charities nationwide, including Fulfill.

David was introduced to Fulfill this past year. Moved by the Organization's mission to end hunger, he not only pledged a leadership gift over the next 5 years, but donated ENCON services in excess of over \$100,000 to upgrade the energy infrastructure in Fulfill's warehouse and install a new cooler that enables Fulfill to provide fresh produce. David's support will be significant to Fulfill for many years to come.

THE ELEANOR LEVINE UNSUNG HERO AWARD

Eleanor Levine, equal partner with her husband Leo in the WindMills, contently worked in the main office of the organization and received very little recognition for her many contributions to the businesses. That selfless attitude also extended into many activities and aspects of her life. She encouraged Leo to be the deliverer of gifts, the granter of loans and the front man for the businesses. She knitted blankets for babies she would never meet, crocheted and mailed hats to men and women in the armed services serving overseas, purchased and had Leo distribute blankets in Miami to homeless people and signed many monthly checks to charities. She performed all of those activities, not only because they were the right things to do, but also to pass down to her children and grandchildren the lessons of humility and giving back. Her lesson was that we are all responsible for our communities, without the need for recognition or glory. To her family and to those lives she anonymously touched, she truly was an Unsung Hero.

Rena and David Levy, in honor of Rena's mother, Eleanor Levine, established the Eleanor Levine Unsung Hero Award to annually recognize volunteers who, much like Eleanor, live their lives selflessly in the service of others. Tonight, the Unsung Hero awards are presented to Patrick Freeman and Debbie Wagner.

Patrick Freeman, of Bradley Beach, began volunteering at Fulfill in 2016 after retiring from the Police force in New York. He has become an indispensable member of the Fulfill family, through his enthusiasm and willingness to pitch in wherever there is a need and always with a big smile. Pat started sorting food in the Neptune Sort Room, but quickly immersed himself in other volunteer opportunities. He has done it all, from Mobile Pantry Truck Assistant to delivering fresh produce to schools. Most recently has helped the Operations team with Food Drive and store donation pick-ups. Pat has also taken a Food Safety course so he is able to meal prep the after school meals that are delivered daily. If there is help needed in the garden, he even steps up there. Pat is the "go-to guy" around Fulfill. The value of Pat's flexibility, friendly attitude, and multi-talents is immeasurable.

Debbie Wagner of Toms River joined Fulfill in 2017. After 39 years of teaching, Deb retired and was eager to stay active and most importantly, involved with fighting childhood hunger. She began volunteering by meal prepping and packing lunches for our Summer Meals Kid's Program. She now is instrumental in our Backpack program and volunteers regularly at the B.E.A.T. Center packing the food that is distributed to school children to assure they have food over the weekend. Her love of teaching shines through to her volunteer commitment. Deb became Fulfill's first School Ambassador. She visited schools throughout Monmouth and Ocean Counties to talk to students about hunger in our communities and what they can do to help. She has also participated in many other events, such as Childhood Hunger Day, Halloween Hay Ride, and on-site support of our pantries and special projects. On top of all that, Deb was also instrumental in the implementation of the Client Management Tool (CMT) software used by our network partners. Deb has become a valuable member of the Fulfill family who makes a difference every time she volunteers.

During the current crisis, we are reminded that Volunteers are the HEART of Fulfill. We would not be able to do what we do, without each and every one of them. Special thanks to our volunteers for their time and dedication, and to Rena and David Levy for recognizing the value of unsung heroes.
